YOU'RE GOING TO NEED HELP

The process can be extremely stressful and a lot of work, and you must remember that your project may not turn out as you had envisioned it. And remember, there are numerous building codes that may apply to your job and you'll need to know them. The second option is to hire a contractor. Contractors can be skilled craftsmen, but most will offer little or no design or budget guidance. Be prepared to select and supply most materials to your contractor that will be installed. Going this route can work well if you have a significant amount of time to dedicate to the project and a true eye for design.

Lastly, you can opt to work with a design/build firm. A design/build firm is quite different from a contractor as it's a one-stop shop; they are responsible for eliminating problems and ensuring you a successful project. A design/ build firm should help you establish a budget, craft the design and layout, provide working plans, assist you in selecting all materials and then oversee your project's construction. At the end of the day, every homeowner wants to avoid a remodeling disaster, and it's worth the extra penny upfront to ensure a successful project while saving time and money in the long run.

A WELL-DESIGNED SPACE

A common phrase consistently heard from clients is "There isn't much we can do with the design; our only option is to remove and replace everything in the same configuration." This is entirely not true. A professional kitchen designer will help create a functional layout to maximize space and
